## **CADASTRAL SURVEYORS LICENSING BOARD OF NEW ZEALAND**

### **Introduction**

The past year has seen the Board's activity maintained at levels similar to recent years. The number of licences remains similar to previous years. Continued demand for entry into the University of Otago School of Surveying, combined with the fact that almost all students choose the cadastral option as one of their disciplines, suggests that there will be sufficient new licences issued to meet demand in the medium term.

The Board received three complaints against cadastral surveyors who have allegedly failed to meet the required standards for cadastral survey. One of the complaints was from the Surveyor-General, and the other two were from individuals not associated with the surveying profession. Two complaints, including the Surveyor-General's, resulted in hearings. The third complaint is under investigation. As each new complaint has its own circumstances the Board is constantly being challenged by new situations that have led to questions about the competency of an individual surveyor.

As a result of the previous year's deficit and a forecast of another for 2011, the Board increased the licensing fee by a small amount for 2012. It also took action to reduce operating costs and has achieved a financial result for the year that shows a small surplus.

### **Jurisdiction**

The Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand is constituted by section 10 of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002.

### **Functions**

The functions and duties undertaken by the Board are set out in section 11 of the Cadastral Survey Act (See Appendix A).

In summary, the primary function of the Board is the licensing of suitably qualified surveyors with current competence to conduct cadastral surveys and lodge them in the cadastral record. For this purpose the Board sets standards for the education and the practical experience required to obtain and retain a cadastral licence.

The Board exercises disciplinary powers in cases where a cadastral surveyor is charged with negligence, incompetence, falsification, or failure to observe the Rules for Cadastral Survey. The Board has the authority to suspend or cancel a licence, or place a surveyor under the supervision of another licensed cadastral surveyor, where professional misconduct is proven. Licences are renewed annually.

In addition, the Board participates in reciprocity arrangements with the eight Australian State and Territory boards.

### **Membership**

Under section 13 of the Act there are five board members appointed by the Minister of Land Information.

The present Board members are:

- Messrs Brett Douglas Gawn and Marton David Sinclair, appointed as nominees of bodies representing licensed cadastral surveyors pursuant to section 13(2)(a);
- Ms Vicki Alma Nalder and Mr Anthony Paul Nikkel appointed pursuant to section 13(2)(b);
- Ms Katharine Margaret Felicity Price, being a person who is not and never has been a licensed cadastral surveyor and is not employed in the surveying profession is appointed pursuant to section 13(2)(c);
- Surveyor-General, Dr Donald Bruce Grant, as an *ex-officio* member of the Board pursuant to section 13(1)(b).
- Ms Merryn Kay Maguire and Ms Marion Grace Miller are substitute members of the Board.

### Meetings

The Board met five times in the 2010/11 year, on;

### Licences

The Board licensed 721 surveyors for the year ending 30 June 2011 consisting of 694 licences renewed, 24 licences issued to surveyors for the first time, and 3 to surveyors who had previously been licensed. The Board issued 727 and 731 licences in the 2009/10 and 2008/09 years respectively. The continued slight reduction in the number of licences issued is not seen as a concern by the Board, given the reduction in cadastral surveying activity caused by the lower level of land development in the economy. The business environment for the survey profession is still very competitive.

The number of licensed surveyors by gender, age group, and ethnicity is given in the following table.

The Board is heartened that the 30 – 39 age band is the largest group. As surveyors are generally in their mid twenties before they have completed their qualifications and experience requirements for licensing, it is not a concern that the number of surveyors in their twenties is only 51. The fact that Maori are under-represented is a matter that the survey profession as a whole is addressing.

The Board issued Letters of Accreditation to eighteen New Zealand surveyors seeking registration as a surveyor in an Australian State, compared to four in 2009/10 seven in 2008/09. This reflects the demand for New Zealand surveyors in Australia and conversely the reduced demand in New Zealand.

The Board received an application from a candidate with academic qualifications from Britain, partially in surveying as well as other disciplines, and extensive cadastral surveying experience in New Zealand. Following a professional interview by a panel of Board members the Board determined the candidate had met all the competencies and standards required for issue of a licence. The Board has received an enquiry from another candidate with qualifications from outside New Zealand and Australia that are currently being assessed by the Bureau for Assessment of Overseas Qualifications.

### **Discipline**

The Board accepted one complaint from the Surveyor-General and following a hearing on 7 March 2011 the Board found the surveyor to be not guilty of professional misconduct.

The Board received two complaints from private individuals relating to the conduct of surveyors. One of these complaints resulted in a hearing on 9 June 2011 where the surveyor was found guilty of professional misconduct. The other is still being investigated by the Board. Two complaints received in the previous year which had not been fully considered at 30 June 2010 were not accepted after the Board completed its investigations.

The Board has been advised by the Surveyor General of seven significant failures in accordance with section 7 (1) (d) of the Act during the year, compared to eight in the previous year. The Board is monitoring a further 14 surveyors who have been notified to the Board in the previous three years. As part of this monitoring, the Board takes a more in depth review of these surveyors on a case by case basis before deciding whether to renew their licences.

### **Licensing Standards**

The Board has continued to recognise the Admissions Interviews conducted by the New Zealand Institute of Surveyors Incorporated as evidence that applicants for initial licences meet the standards of competencies adopted by the Board. The Board monitors the conduct of these examinations.

As part of its responsibilities to monitor academic qualifications and practical requirements for the licensing of surveyors, the Board maintains contact with the National School of Surveying at the University of Otago, the only university in New Zealand that offers degrees in surveying.

### **Reciprocity**

Full reciprocity between the New Zealand surveyors' boards and the 8 Australian State and Territory surveyors' boards has existed since 1901, although a reciprocity agreement with Australian boards has existed from 1892. The Board also collaborates with the Australian boards on the assessment of other overseas qualifications for equivalence to the New Zealand and Australian degrees and setting policies for the education, training and regulation of surveyors.

Contact with the Australian boards is maintained directly at board level through the Council of the Reciprocating Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand, comprising the Chairs of each board. Meetings of the Council are generally held once per year. In the last year the Council has completed a review of its terms of reference. The New Zealand board made a significant contribution to this review that has updated the agreement to meet the current business and regulatory environments in our two countries.

The Board will host the next meeting in Wellington in November 2011.

### **Finance**

The Board is funded entirely by licensing fees gathered annually from licensed cadastral surveyors. The level of those fees is set by the Board under section 11(1)(c) of the Act. The Board has achieved a small surplus this year due to reducing its' operating cost by holding fewer meetings to reduce Board members fees and travel costs, and keeping secretarial fees and costs less than last year. There were also fewer disciplinary hearings than in past years, and a reduction in sundry expenses.

For the two previous years the Board ran an operating deficit and at the time the fee was set for 2011/12 another deficit was forecast. As a result the Board decided on a small increase in the licence fee for the 2011/12 year from \$179.40 to \$184.00. The fee is still \$27.50 lower than it was when the Board was established in 2002.

### **Administration**

The Board continues to contract the Institute of Professional Engineers New Zealand (IPENZ) to provide administrative services, office facilities and meeting rooms. IPENZ maintains full time office hours, dedicated telephone and facsimile point of contact, and hosts the Board's website. This is considered to be a very valuable and efficient arrangement for the Board.

Mr Rob Munro, solicitor, of Wellington, has been retained as the Board's legal advisor and Mr Jeremy Maseyk contracted as the Board Secretary.

**APPENDIX A: FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES**

The functions and duties of the board, as set out in section 11 of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002 are:

- (a) To maintain a register of cadastral surveyors licensed under this Act.
- (b) To receive applications for licences under this Act as cadastral surveyors and to issue licences in proper cases.
- (c) To set fees for the issue and renewal of licences under this Act.
- (d) To issue and update standards that persons applying for licences, or the renewal of licences, under this Act must be met.
- (e) To investigate complaints about cadastral surveyors and take disciplinary action in appropriate cases under this Act.
- (f) To provide statistical information to the Minister about cadastral surveyors as requested by the Minister.
- (g) To perform such other functions or duties conferred on it by this Act or any other enactment.

## **APPENDIX B: AUDIT REPORT**

### **To the Members of Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand**

#### **Report on the Financial Statements**

We have audited the financial statements of Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand on pages 10 to 15, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2011, and the statement of financial performance, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

#### **Board Members' Responsibilities**

The board members are responsible for the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice in New Zealand and for such internal control as the board members determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

#### **Auditor's Responsibilities**

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation of financial statements that give a true and fair view of the matters to which they relate in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control.

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates, as well as evaluating the presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Other than in our capacity as auditor we have no relationship with, or interests in Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand.





### **NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

#### **FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2011**

#### **1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

##### **a. Reporting Entity**

The financial statements presented here are for the reporting entity Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand (CSLB) which commenced operations on 1 June 2002.

##### **b. Reporting Basis**

The CSLB is required to prepare financial statements pursuant to Section 19 Cadastral Survey Act 2002 and in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices.

##### **c. Measurement Base**

The measurement base adopted is historical cost.

##### **d. Specific Accounting Policies**

###### **(i) Differential Reporting**

The CSLB is a qualifying entity within the Institute of Chartered Accountants of New Zealand Differential Reporting Framework. The Board qualifies under the size criteria and because it is not publicly accountable. The Board has taken advantage of all differential reporting exemptions available to it except for Financial Reporting Standard 10 Statement of Cash Flows.

###### **(ii) Goods and Service Tax**

The Statement of Financial Position and Performance have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis except for accounts receivable and payable which are GST inclusive.

###### **(iii) Taxation**

The entity is exempt from income tax on the basis that it falls under Section CW38 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

###### **(iv) Changes in Accounting Policies**

There have been no changes in the accounting policies. All policies have been applied on basis consistent with those used in previous years.

#### **2. NATURE AND ACTIVITIES OF THE BOARD**

The Board was established by and operates under the Cadastral Survey Act 2002. This Act requires cadastral surveys to be carried out by, or under the direction of, a licensed cadastral surveyor, who must meet the standards for competence and licensing set by the board.

#### **3. ANNUAL CADASTRAL SURVEYORS LICENSE FEES**

Annual Cadastral Surveyors License Certificates expire on 30 June each year. Applications for renewal each year may be lodged at any time after 1 April for the following twelve month period commencing 1 July.

A number of applications for renewal are received and paid in advance during the period between 1 April and 30 June each year. These license fees received in advance are shown separately on the Statement of Financial Position and are taken up as income in the financial year to which they relate.

#### **4. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES**

The CSLB had no contingent liabilities as at balance date. (2010 Nil)

## 5. COMMITMENTS

The CSLB had no commitments as at balance date. (2010 Nil)

## 6. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

During the year the CSLB has had no related party transactions. No related party debts have been written off or forgiven during the year.
